Improving Asthma in Ohio Schools Program Overview

Asthma in Ohio Almost 8% of children under 18 (190,000) have a diagnosis of asthma. For many children, unmanaged symptoms disrupt daily life and impair their ability to learn and play to the fullest. The burden is even higher among some communities: the prevalence rate among children in low-income households is 10.9% (compared to 6.4% among children from households that make \$50,000 or above), and the prevalence rate among Black children is more than twice that of white children (3.9% compared to 5.6%, respectively). Unfortunately, Black children in Ohio also visit the emergency department (ED) and hospital for asthma at a rate more than four times greater than that of white children.
